Hon. Handicap Secretary Report 2018

2018 had a very busy wet beginning and then a very hot summer, we had 42 qualifying 18-hole competitions and 47 qualifying 9-hole competitions. We also had 26 Open competitions. Our 9-hole qualifying competitions are becoming very popular, not only with our new ladies but with all ladies now playing 9-hole qualifying rounds when they don't have enough time to get 18 holes in. We held 18-hole Open Competition every Monday from April to October we also held two Ladies Opens one in June and one in August.

We also played foursomes and scrambles which are an important part of our social calendar.

This year we had a new category. This is category 6 with handicaps from 36-45. Any new member allocated a new handicap this year could acquire a handicap of up to 45. In 2019 this handicap category will go up to 54.

Under the new handicap system we had to review any member with a handicap of 36 and depending on their buffer zone they could be considered for a 2 or 4 shot increase. These reviews were carried out between March and April 2018.

Following on from our very successful "Get into Golf" from last year that resulted in a number of new lady members it was decided to run it again this year but on a smaller scale. We did get a number of ladies this year and I would like to thank Lady Captain Laura and Geraldine Finnegan and all the ladies who helped make it a success for their hard work and of course Tony our professional who again provided lessons for all the ladies. For 2019 we have put in place a special one year membership deal for these ladies and at the end they may opt to become full or five day members.

In 2019 we have new rules coming in, we will try and advise you with as many as possible, some of these are listed on our website so please look them up and get a copy of the new rules book 2019.
