## COMPETITION NOTICE

1. Competition Entry: To enter a competition a player must ensure the following before starting to play: - For all Singles and Team competitions, the player must be entered on the BRS timesheet for the relevant competition before play commences and enter their Golf Ireland number or swipe their card in the computer in the Pro Shop.
2. A competition is deemed to be over when the result is announced. It is the player's responsibility to ensure his/her correct handicap is on their score card.
3. Except when a Time Sheet is in operation, or an exception has been advertised in advance, competitors playing on Saturday or Sunday competitions must commence play not later than 4.00pm.
4. All competition cards must clearly show the competitor's name, course handicap, the gross score at each hole and the signature of the competitor and marker. Cards must be fully completed before entering the Clubhouse or Locker Room after finishing play. Completed competition cards must be posted in the special box set aside for that purpose within 30 minutes of completion of the competition – or if two competitions are being played – 30 minutes after the latter competition being completed.
5. Competition cards must be filled in on the course after each hole has been played. In exceptional circumstances where it is deemed advisable to submit a copy, the original card must be posted with the copy, the latter clearly marked "COPY". In all competitions scorecards must be marked by a player with an official Golf Ireland handicap. In the case of a Junior marker they must be eligible to compete in the competition for which the card is being marked.
6. Competitors must be a member for a period of 12 months to be eligible to win the Captain's Prize / Lady Captain's Prize or President's / Lady President's Prizes. All members must have competed in a minimum of three Qualifying Competitions during the current season in order to be eligible to win the Captain/Lady Captain's Prizes or President or Lady President's Prizes.
7. On any day when a 'mixed' stroke play competition follows another competition, practice will be permitted on the competition course, prior to competing in the 'mixed' stroke competition. As per note to Rule 5-2(a) and confirmed by the R&A.

### **Golfer of the Year Men's Club**

Points will be awarded for all qualifying events (Monthly Medals and selected Competitions) indicated in diary as GOY as follows:

For each event 1<sup>st</sup> Place = 25 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup> Place = 24pts, 3<sup>rd</sup> Place = 23pts and in descending points order to 25<sup>th</sup> Place = 1 pt. Golfer of the Year will be awarded to the player who has accumulated the highest points for all qualifying events played at the end of the year.

### **Gross Golfer of the Year Men's Club**

The same scoring principle as Golfer of the Year (above) applies. Points are awarded for best placed Gross scores in all qualifying GOY events starting from 25 pts for the Best Gross down to 1 point for 25<sup>th</sup> best gross score on the day.

However, rather than the points awarded after each competition counting, the winner of the Gross Golfer of the Year (decided after the October Medal) will be based on the players best GOY Gross points achieved in a maximum of 5 events.

## **Mens Competitions Conditions**

### **BRS Competition Purse Refund Policy**

As per decisions of the Mens Committees the following cut-off times apply to receive a refund of entry fees where a member or their guests are removed from the timesheet: -

- For all weekend & bank holiday club competitions members have until 6.00pm the day before a competition starts.
- All Wednesday competitions, members have 60 minutes before their tee time to cancel.
- Failure to attend on the day may be brought to the attention of the committee

### **Appeals Process**

If a member has a valid reason for a refund they must email the office at [margaret@forrestlitttle.ie](mailto:margaret@forrestlitttle.ie) with an explanation and she will bring it to the Honorary Secretary's attention for review. Decisions are final.

### **Times of Starting**

Players should start at time reserved on BRS or as instructed by the pro shop staff on the day, or at the time given by competitions committee (specific competitions).

Players should not compete prior to official start time or after last designated tee time unless permission is given by competitions committee or pro shop staff.

### **Groups:**

Competitors shall remain throughout their round in the group as arranged by the Competition Committee or Pro shop staff .

### **Time Sheets:**

Players shall not play unless they have an allocated time slot on the BRS (i.e., may not cut in between groups); Be present on the tee box and ready to play, ten minutes prior to their designated start time, having checked in at the Proshop first. Failure to tee off on time may result in players being penalised; (Rule 5.3a applies) must notify their opposition/playing partners in good time if they are withdrawing from the event. (Reserving a time slot is a commitment to play with and/or mark other player's scores on that time slot).

### **Handicap Rules and Allowances:**

The rules and allowances that shall apply for handicapping are those prescribed by Golf Ireland and set out in the WHS (World Handicap System) Rules of Handicapping effective January 2020. Players are asked to familiarise themselves with the system. In all Club Competitions including Semi Opens, Invitation and Open events as organised by the Competition Committee, the only handicaps acceptable and recognised for prize eligibility shall be for players of affiliated Clubs.

### Eligibility for Competitions and Prizes

Full Member	They can participate in all eligible competitions and compete for all prizes
Intermediate 26 - 32	They can participate in all eligible competitions and compete for all prizes except for the first prize in the Captains Prize & Presidents Prize.
Junior 18 – 25	They can participate in all eligible competitions and compete for all prizes except for the first prize in the Captains Prize & Presidents Prize.
Juniors Under 18	To be eligible to play in Weekend and Wednesday competitions they must hold a playing handicap of 18 or less for the course in play for that competition. They can compete for all prizes. To be eligible to play in the 8 Monthly Medals, Club Scratch Cup & Club Cup they must hold a playing handicap of 11 or less for the course in play on the day. They can compete for all prizes. To be eligible to play in the Club Matchplay tournaments they must hold a playing handicap of 11 or less for the course in play on the day of qualifying. If their handicap increases during the match play stage this is accepted. They can compete for all prizes. They are not eligible to participate in the Captains Prize, Presidents Prize, Professionals Prize and Vice Captains Prize .
New Members	New members who have been allocated a handicap in Forrest Little after submitting 3 cards must play a minimum of 3 ‘acceptable score’ 18 hole club competitions in Forrest Little before being eligible to win any of the ‘acceptable score’ competitions. However, they are eligible to compete for any other prizes during this period. This does not apply to members who have transferred handicaps from another club and who have played 3 ‘acceptable score’ 18 hole competitions in the past 6 months in their previous club. To be eligible to win a Golfer of the Year event, new members that submitted 3 cards for handicap must have 20 ‘acceptable score’ 18 hole competition scores

on their record before they can compete for first prize. They can compete for all other prizes.

To be eligible to win a Monthly Medal new members who have transferred handicaps from their previous club must have 20 'acceptable score' 18 hole competition scores on their record in the previous 12 months before they can compete for first prize. They can compete for all other prizes.

New Members must have been accepted as a member of Forrest Little Golf Club at least 12 months prior to the qualifying competition for the Captain's and Presidents Prizes to be eligible to compete for first prize in either of these competitions. They also must have 20 x 18 hole acceptable scores on their record in the 12 month period.

### **Competitions for Golfer of the Year**

The following 12 competitions will count for Golfer of the Year, the format will be announced in advance:

8 Medals March - October

President's Prize

Professionals Prize

Club Cup Qualifier

Club Scratch Cups (nett score only)

Points will be awarded to each player finishing in the top 25 places with ties resolved. First place will be awarded 25 points, second 24 points and so on until 25<sup>th</sup> place is awarded 1 point. Points accumulated over the 12 competitions will decide the Golfer of the Year.

Where players have the same total, players will be ordered by their Presidents Prize score. If still a tie, then players will be ordered by their Professionals Prize score. If still tied, there will be a 3 hole playoff arranged by the Competitions Committee to finalise a winner.

### **Competitions for Gross Golfer of the Year**

The following 12 competitions will count for the Gross Golfer of the Year, the format will be announced in advance:

8 Medals March - October

President's Prize

Professionals Prize

Club Cup Qualifier

Club Scratch Cups

Points will be awarded to each player finishing in the top 25 places with ties resolved. 1<sup>st</sup> place will be awarded 25 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> 24 points and so on until 25<sup>th</sup> place is awarded 1 point.

Points accumulated from the players best five competitions will decide the Gross Golf of the Year.

Where players have the same total, players will be ordered by their Presidents Prize score. If still a tie, then players will be ordered by their Professionals Prize score. If still tied there will be a 3 hole playoff, arranged by the Competitions Committee to finalise a winner.

### **Handicap Classes**

Classes in Singles Competitions will be based on the number of players competing in any given class to ensure a fair distribution of prizes.

### **Practicing on the Course**

18-hole competitions being conducted over more than one day Members and Committees are directed to Rule 5.2:

When a competition is scheduled on a course over consecutive days and some players are scheduled to play on the first day and others to play on a later day, a player is **NOT ALLOWED** to practise on the course on any day that he or she is not scheduled to play his or her round.

For example, if a competition is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday and a player is only scheduled to play on Sunday, that player is **NOT ALLOWED** to practise on the course on Saturday.

### **Teeing Ground:**

The stipulated round commences from the first tee and consists of playing the holes in sequence prescribed by the Competition Committee, unless otherwise authorised by them. There are four tee positions for each hole, Blue, Yellow, White & Red. The Competition Committee will notify what tee position is being used for that day's competition. When mats are in use players **MUST** stand on the mat and **MUST** tee their ball on the mat.

### **Score Cards:**

All competitors must ensure that the date of competition, name of competition, name(s) of player(s) and their playing handicap(s) are on the card.

- A competitor should not mark or alter his own score card.
- Score cards should be marked and signed before entering the Club House, except where adverse weather dictates otherwise. Members are reminded that failure to sign the score card will result in disqualification.
- A scorecard is considered returned as soon as the player places it in the competition box.
- Players are responsible for ensuring the accuracy of their scores on each hole and promptly returning the scorecard to the Committee at the completion of the round.
- The Committee will tell players where to return scorecards. Any potential issues the players might have during their round should be brought to the attention of the competition committee and the proshop staff immediately after their round. All scores must be validated prior to the competition being closed.

Members are asked to:

- Enter the points scored for each hole on the scorecard in Stableford.
- Total the scores or, in a Four-Ball competition, determine the score that counts for the side.

Members must:

- Enter all scores into the computer and return the card as soon as possible after the round, whether the player completed the course or not.

Failure to comply with these requests could result in a player being sanctioned by the Competition Committee.

### **Stroke Play Result:**

This is final when the competition is closed, verified by the competition committee and the results posted.

### **Non-Return of Cards in Acceptable Score Singles Competitions:**

The Club will apply the World Handicap System recommendations. These may be viewed online on the Golf Ireland or WHS websites.

If a player fails to submit a score and has not provided a valid reason why, the Handicap Committee will consider withdrawing the players Handicap Index and/or applying a penalty score.

If there are genuine reasons why a player or group must terminate their round, they should send a written explanation to the Handicap Secretary by email to [menshandicap@forrestlittie.ie](mailto:menshandicap@forrestlittie.ie) within three days.

### **Disputes and Rules of Golf:**

Any dispute or doubtful point should firstly be reported to the competition secretary or any member of the competition committee as soon as possible. If a member is unhappy with the outcome of a decision or a ruling, he can appeal to the Men's Committee whose decision shall be final. Email [menscomps@forrestlittie.ie](mailto:menscomps@forrestlittie.ie) with any appeal.

### **How Ties Will Be Decided**

#### **Stroke Play - Scorecard Count-Back**

- The winner is based on the best score for the last round. If the tying players have the same score for the last round or if the competition consisted of a single round, the winner is based on the score for the last nine holes, last six holes, last three holes and finally the last hole. If there is still a tie, then the last nine holes, six holes, three holes and final hole of the first nine holes will be considered in turn.
- If the round is less than 18 holes, last nine holes played, last six holes, last three holes and last hole will determine the winner.
- If this process does not result in a winner, a winner will be based on the last 9, then 8, then 7, the 6, then 5, then 4, then 3, then 2, then 1 holes. If still a tie there will be two prizes awarded of equal value.
- If the Competition Committee allows play to start at 10<sup>th</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> Tees simultaneously the last nine holes for the purpose of deciding ties will be from 10<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> Hole.

### **Prizes and Presentations:**

Notice will be sent to all competition winners and dates of official presentations will be posted on the notice board in advance.

Winning Golfers of the Year competitions are expected to attend Prize Presentations as a courtesy to our Officers, Sponsors and Members. If due to exceptional circumstances a member is unable to be present, he must nominate another person to collect the prize on his behalf and inform the competition secretary that he is unable to attend.

Prizes for other weekly competitions will be available for collection in the Bar. The Club will not be responsible for the safety or security of prizes not collected. A prize not collected within three months of presentation will be forfeited.

### **General Conditions:**

The Competition Committee reserves the right to: -

- refuse entry to a competition, citing the reason.
- correct any mistakes made in the checking of score cards.
- alter published competition conditions if it is deemed necessary up to the time the competition commences.



- cancel any competition due to insufficient entries or to postpone or abandon it at any stage due to exceptional circumstances.

If, for any cause the Course Superintendent, Captain, or in their absence the Vice-Captain, Competition Secretary, Club Professional or any other officer or member of the Club duly authorised by the Men's or Ladies Committee, consider it expedient to postpone or abandon any competition, they shall have the power to do so under any circumstances, and at any stage of the competition.

If, in the event of adverse weather conditions or lightning in the area, the club will follow the Adverse weather or Lightning policies. Please make yourself aware of them in the event of them coming into effect.

### **Qualification for Captain's and President's Prizes**

To be eligible to win the Captain's and President's prizes members must have played 3 acceptable score 18 hole competitions in Forrest Little Golf Club since the 1st January that year, prior to the Captain's/President's qualifying competition. The committee may change this in exceptional circumstances e.g. non acceptable score conditions in place for an extended period due to bad weather. Full terms of these competitions will be posted in the locker room prior to the qualifying rounds.

### **Mandatory Conditions of Competition for all clubs from Golf Ireland:**

- a) Eligibility: To be eligible to compete in a Singles acceptable score Competition at an Away Club, except for all events listed in Golf Ireland's Tournament Conditions Book, a Member of a Golf Ireland Affiliated Golf Club must have returned at least three scores in Singles acceptable score Competitions at his Home Club, at any time on or after the corresponding date one year before the Singles acceptable score Competition at the Away Club.
- b) Entries: The use of a Golf Ireland Member Card is mandatory for members of clubs affiliated to the Golf Ireland for entry into all Open Singles acceptable score Competitions, which shall be by Computer Entry and uploaded to the WHS following close of Competition.

### **Match Play:**

The Conditions under which Club match play competitions are to be played shall be laid down by the Competition Committee and displayed on notice boards and draw sheets. Members must familiarise themselves with these before playing matches. All match play competitions shall be played under the jurisdiction of the Men's or Ladies Competition Committee.

On publication of the draw, matches must be completed by the end date of the round. Any extensions must be requested in writing to the Competition Secretary. Failure to do so will result in both players being disqualified.

### **Match Play Result:**

This is final when the result is verified by the competition committee after being recorded on the Matchplay sheet in the locker room.

### **How Ties Will Be Decided**

#### **Match Play**

- If a match is tied after the final hole, the match is extended one hole at a time until there is a winner (see Rule 3.2a(4)).
- If play stops due to darkness, weather conditions or other emergency at the finish of a hole, it must resume from the next hole at an agreed date. In these circumstances the players must inform the competition secretary that they are continuing at another date.
- A tie in a match cannot be decided by a stroke-play play-off.

### **General Play For Handicap Purposes**

- Players may return GP scores for handicap purposes when not playing in an organised competition.
- The Golf Ireland App, which provides for pre-registration and return of GP scores should be used where possible.
- The Course on which the GP round is being played must be in Acceptable Score condition and playing to its full length.
- If a player does not use the Golf Ireland App and the computer terminal is not available, a GP pre-registration form, must be used to record the intention to submit a GP Score.
- If a player has registered their intention to return a GP score on-line but not submitted their score, they must return the properly completed scorecard to the Club handicap secretary with the Member Number of the marker clearly shown, if not a Home Club member.
- If a player has registered their intention to return a GP score offline (i.e. not using the Golf Ireland App) they must return the properly completed scorecard to the Club with the Member Number of the marker clearly shown if not a Home Club member, together with evidence of off-line pre-registration. If the round is played at an Away Club. A photograph of the pre-registration sheet would be appropriate.
- Wherever possible, it is recommended that a player returns one 18-hole GP score as opposed to two 9-hole GP scores on the same day.
- Players are entitled to maintain a handicap through GP scores only.

### **PRIORITY ON THE COURSE**

All players must be registered on the BRS before commencing play.

In addition to the players being registered to play on the BRS, priority on the course is determined by a group's pace of play.

If a match fails to keep its place on the course by losing more than one clear hole on the players in front, then it should allow the match following to pass.

#### **Juniors:**

Junior Members must give way to other members on the 1<sup>st</sup> Tee at all times. (The only exception to this Rule is when Juniors are competing in their own competition or are eligible, by handicap, to compete in the competition of the day.)

## **ELIGIBILITY OF JUNIOR BOYS (UNDER 18 YEARS) TO PLAY IN COMPETITIONS**

### **Criteria for competing in Various Competitions**

Where the Competition is governed by a handicap limit (e.g. Junior/Intermediate Scratch Cup) junior boys under 18 years of age are eligible to compete on achieving the Qualifying Handicap. Junior Boys Under 18 pay the full fee, and can win the main prize.

### **Semi-Open, Invitation and Open Competitions**

Where Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) are 18 handicap or less, they may play with an ordinary member on payment of the full fee and can win the main prize.

### **Team Events**

- a) Two person team a junior boy (under 18 years of age) may play but must be paired with an Ordinary Member.
- b) Three person team event two junior boys (under 18 years of age) may play but must be partnered by an Ordinary Member.
- c) Four person team event two junior boys (under 18 years of age) may play but must be partnered by two Ordinary Members.

### **Club Fourball, Foursomes, Team Event and Single Competitions:**

Where Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) are 18 handicap or less they may play on payment of the full fee and win the main prize.

Fourball and Foursomes: Junior boys (under 18 years of age) can play with another junior boy, but must play opposite two Ordinary Members.

Singles: Two junior boys (under 18 years of age) can play with one Ordinary Member.

Team Events: Same criteria applies as for semi-open and invitation open competitions.

### **Club Matchplay Cups: Singles Fourball, Foursomes Qualifying Competitions:**

Having achieved a 14 Handicap or less, Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) may compete on payment of the full fee, partnered/accompanied by an ordinary member and may win the main prize.

Singles: Two Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) can play with one ordinary member (Qualifying round)

### **Foursomes and Fourball. (Hamill and Allshire Cups):**

A Junior Boy (under 18 years of age) must play with an Ordinary Member as his partner.

### **Medals / I.P.G.A. Tankard:**

Having achieved a handicap of 11 or less Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) may play in the above competitions on payment of the full fee and are eligible to win all prizes.

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### **Captains, Lady Captains, Vice Captains, Presidents and Professionals Prize:**

Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) are excluded from competing in the above Competitions, as special prizes are awarded in their own competitions.

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## **Hampers and Bottle Day**

Hampers: Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) having achieved a handicap of 11 or under are eligible to compete but only qualify to win a voucher.

Bottle Day: Junior Boys (under 18 years of age) are excluded from competing.

**NOTE:** For the purposes of compliance with the above conditions a Junior Adult Member (18 to 26 years of age) and/or an Intermediate member is deemed to be an Ordinary Member. Junior Adult Members and Intermediate Members may play in the Captains, Vice Captains and Presidents Prize on payment of the normal entry fee and are eligible to win a prize but not the main prize.

## **HANDICAP ALLOWANCES**

**Golf Ireland** directs that the following handicap allowances be used for the undernoted forms of competition when played as handicap events and, where relevant, for the calculation of the *Competition Scratch Score* in scratch competitions. The reference to handicaps in all cases refers to *Playing Handicaps*. Strokes must be taken according to the Handicap Stroke Index.

**Note 1: Half Strokes.** Half strokes or over to be counted as one; smaller fractions to be disregarded except in Foursomes Stroke Play when 1/2 strokes are counted as such.

**Note 2: Handicap Allowances.** In a handicap competition played in any of the above formats the allowances must be laid down by the Committee in the Conditions of the Competition (*Rules of Golf* 33-1) in accordance with the above direction.

**Note 3: 36 Holes.** In handicap competitions over 36 holes strokes should be given or taken on the basis of two 18 hole rounds in accordance with the 18 hole Handicap Stroke Index unless the Committee introduces a special Stroke Index.

**Note 4: Hole-by-hole Play-off (sudden-death).** When extra holes are played in handicap competitions, strokes should be taken in accordance with the Handicap Stroke Index.

#### **Other Forms of Play**

The Council of National Golf Unions recommends the following allowances:

**Greensomes** *Lower handicap x 0.6 plus higher handicap x 0.4*
